

Why Nebraska? Nebraska is a leader in beef production in a sustainable and robust environment. First in red meat production, first in commercial cattle harvest, second in cattle and calves, second in cattle on feed, and 25 million acres of perennial grazing lands – there is good reason Nebraska is known as the Beef State. The unique combination of forage and water supply, crop and ethanol production, feeding and packing infrastructure, and a resource stewardship ethic make Nebraska a world leader in sustained beef production.




Environmentally sound, resilient, socially responsible, and economically viable beef for Nebraska and beyond.





To advance, support, and communicate continuous improvement of beef production, economic vitality, and natural resources through innovative research, education, and extension.
